

DANIEL A. SEEGER

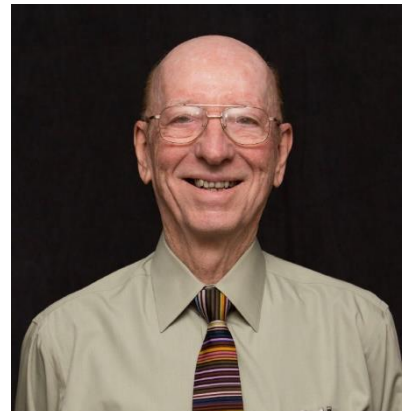
Dan Seeger has been involved with CCRC life since 1991, when his parents moved to Medford Leas in southern New Jersey.

He has been instrumental in developing NaCCRA's Consumers Guide to CCRCs, and its Financial Soundness Handbook for Residents and Prospective Residents of CCRCs.
